


#### MHS Students Attend Build My Future

On September 25th, **The Wausau Area Builders Association** hosted **Build My Future Northcentral WI** at Kolbe Windows & Doors in Wausau. The annual event provides an excellent opportunity for students to gain knowledge on different careers offered within the trades, and encourages students to get involved in real-world jobs. Mosinee High School had 72 students attend, all of whom participate in high school technical education programs: construction, woodworking, engineering, graphic design, machining, and welding.



At the event students had the opportunity to operate heavy machinery, paint vehicles, fix dented car panels, weld through an electronic simulator, compete in pounding nails into large rail ties, and take in the view from an aerial lift. The interactive event opened the students' eyes to a wide array of future career paths.

### Fall Season Brings a Flurry of Activity to the Mosinee School District



I hope everyone is enjoying the fall season we are having. This is a busy time of year in the district, with the budget being finalized, student activities both winding down and ramping up, and the review of recent assessment results.

One of the most important tasks the district undertakes in the fall is setting the levy, which impacts the mill rate. During the Annual Meeting, the projected budget is presented, and a preliminary levy is approved, with the final levy set by the Board of Education at its October meeting. This delay allows time for the finalization of state aid, which is determined on

October 15th, and the property valuations of each municipality. These two factors, along with the student enrollment count, are key components in determining the final levy and mill rate for the district. All of these factors are typically finalized over a two-week period in early October.

I am pleased to inform residents that the mill rate is projected to decrease. If the referendum passes, the mill rate will decrease by three cents from last year, going from \$5.92 in 2024 to a projected \$5.89 this year.

Another seasonal shift in the district is the transition of student activities – fall sports are winding down, while winter sports are starting up, rehearsals for the musical are in full swing, and club activities are under way. Our students are excited to showcase their talents in various arenas, whether it's an athletic contest, an auditorium, a classroom, or a competition. We are proud of their accomplishments in all areas of their education.

This time of year also brings a focus on assessment results. While the state report cards are not yet publicly available, we're excited to share that our current seniors achieved an impressive average score of 21.6 on the ACT last year. This is the highest mark in the history of Mosinee High School, as well as the highest in the Great Northern Conference and Marathon County. We are incredibly proud of our students' achievements and recognize that their success is a testament to the dedication of not only the students themselves but also their families, our staff, and the greater community.

I would also like to take a moment to thank the community for their involvement in the referendum process. As I've mentioned at various community meetings, my only request during a referendum is for the community to become informed about what is being proposed and then exercise their right to vote. As a district, we will respect and respond to the wishes of the community. Once again, thank you for your engagement throughout this process and for taking the time to understand what we are asking for.

I hope everyone enjoys a wonderful month, and let's hope the snow holds off for a little while longer. If you have any questions regarding the district, please feel free to reach out to me or any of the building principals.

#### Class of 2025 Earns ACT Champions Title

The ACT is a state required test which all eleventh grade students take each spring. The results from last March were recently released and Mosinee High School has much to celebrate. The ACT scores from the Class of 2025 are the highest in all of Marathon County and the Great Northern Conference (GNC). The Class of 2025's average is 21.6, while the Wisconsin State average is 19.2. In fact, the scores are almost 2 points higher than the other schools in the GNC, which is an earth shattering feat. **Principal Tom McCarty** brought the whole student body together on Monday, October 21st to share the scores and celebrate the accomplishments of the Class of 2025, teachers, and support staff. Congratulations on this remarkable achievement!



#### **Fire Safety Lessons**

On September 13th, all nine students in **Mr. Jeffrey Heise's** English Skills class went on their first monthly field trip to **Willow Haven Community-Based Residential Facility** in Mosinee where they met the residents they are exchanging pen pal letters with. Mr. Heise implemented the program in his classroom to help students build connections, empathy, and communication skills – both verbal and written – while giving the residents a voice and an opportunity to share their stories with young people.

During their first visit, the students brought the residents a bouquet of flowers and cookies to brighten their day. They engaged in get-

to-know-you conversations with their pen pals, asking thoughtful questions and practicing active listening. Later, the students wrote their first monthly letters, focusing on interpersonal writing, applying the conventions they



are learning about, and incorporating engaging questions. The residents will reply with their own letters each month, further strengthening this connection.

Mr. Heise views this initiative as an effective way for students to utilize their writing skills. They plan to continue these monthly visits, with one or two extra special visits around the holidays, to deepen their understanding of one another and enhance their interpersonal skills.

## **E-Hall Pass Program**

Mosinee Middle and High Schools have implemented a new program called E-Hall Pass to address issues with students habitually leaving classes and sometimes abusing this privilege. This decision was made collaboratively over the summer of 2024 by both middle and high school administrators, who found that the physical paper passes previously used were no longer fulfilling our need to keep students safe and engaged. This program allows for consistency among teachers and staff; in the past, passes were handled inconsistently with students who requested to go to the bathroom, their lockers, the office, the nurse, student services, other classrooms, etc. As a result, hallway traffic increased, the number of times individual students left their classes could not be monitored, and students were able to avoid classes, meet with other students to possibly make poor choices, or create safety concerns. The reports and data generated with E-Hall Pass assist with conversations with students, families, and staff, making our schools safer, students more productive, and teachers better able to stay connected with their students to help them be successful. Tom McCarty, high school principal, states: "So far, we have seen a positive shift with these changes." While there was a learning curve for everyone involved, it is proving to be a change that benefits students, staff, administration, and families.

The kindergarten students took a field trip to **Schairer's Autumn Acres** in Birnamwood for some hands-on learning about pumpkins. While on the trip, the students were able to take a hayride, complete a corn maze, spend time with animals at the petting zoo, play on the playground, and pick a pumpkin to take home.
